Habitat for Humanity Australia was incorporated in 2008 as a not-for-profit company limited by guarantee and operates two charitable funds: Habitat for Humanity Australia Overseas Aid Fund and Habitat for Humanity Australia Domestic Fund. Both Habitat for Humanity Australia funds are regulated by the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act and hold tax endorsements, concessions and deductible gift recipient (DGR) status.

HFHA Board

The Board comprises 7-9 directors with diverse skills and attributes recruited to a skills matrix. Time Commitment – Bi monthly meetings of the board, one strategic planning day and

Committee meetings each year (some on the same day as Board meetings) all held in Sydney and by teleconference.
