What is workplace giving?

Workplace giving is a simple and low-cost, yet powerful way to donate

to Habitat for Humanity Australia through your payroll system.

How does it work?

You can support our work and make an impact to thousands of families through automated deductions from your pre-tax pay.

If this system is already in place at your workplace, all you need to do is contact your payroll officer or Human Resources department to select us as your charity.

Through workplace giving, you will receive an automatic tax deduction so there is no need to claim your receipts at the end of the financial year. Donations can start, be changed or stopped at any point in time.

Workplace giving offers a range of benefits to employers, employees and most importantly, the families in need that your donation supports.

Benefits for Employers
