Worldwide, Habitat has helped more than 62 million people access safe and decent housing, along with access to Water, Sanitation and Hygiene and livelihood training to build better lives. how Habitat works to alleviate poverty



Habitat believes that new and improved homes are intricately tied to better opportunities for families. Children have quiet places to study. Families no longer face illnesses and disease brought on by unhealthy housing. Parents experience the financial freedom that comes from having an affordable place to live. These factors help break the cycle of generational poverty.

Habitat for Humanity knows that a decent, affordable place to live can create a situation where homeowners save more, invest in education, pursue opportunity and have more financial stability.

Living in a decent, affordable home they've helped build or improve means a homeowner is better positioned to have a healthier, more financially stable life, one with fewer barriers to health, safety and opportunity.

Access to safe, secure adequate housing is one of the most **basic human rights.**



Australia

Australia is experiencing a severe and worsening housing crisis, marked by deficits in available housing, high levels of unaffordability, poor tenure security for renters and poor quality of housing.


- House prices and rents are growing faster than wages, rental vacancies are near all-time lows, 169,000 households are on public housing waiting lists, 122,000 people are experiencing homelessness and projected housing supply is very low. (State of the Housing System, 2024)
- >500,000 low-income households not in appropriate housing (2021)
- 1 in 4 Households experiencing housing stress (2024)

Asia Pacific

- Women face discrimination in many aspects of housing, land and property on the basis of their gender. This represents a key obstacle to the realisation of the right to adequate housing, as it often leads women to live in inadequate housing.
- Globally and regionally, disasters are occurring with greater frequency and greater severity. 225 million people in Asia and the Pacific were displaced by weather-related hazards from 2010-2021
- The Asia-Pacific region is home to the largest concentration of people experiencing urban poverty, with one third of urban dwellers living in slums or slumlike conditions.

strategic plan

The scale of the housing deficit in Australia and across Asia and the Pacific requires a radical change. It is no longer sufficient that we build alone, we must influence the systems that affect access to housing if we are to have meaningful impact.



Through this strategy, Habitat for Humanity Australia will grow our role as an enabler and collaborator of the housing sector to support the delivery of impactful housing solutions focused on increasing access to decent, secure, affordable and resilient housing for the most vulnerable.

We will increase our focus on advocacy and mobilise more volunteers and supporters to achieve greater impact.

We will develop key capabilities by strengthening systems and processes for volunteer management and impact measurement, further integrating climate change mitigation strategies and deepening our partnerships across the sector.

strategic plan

Over the next three years, Habitat for Humanity Australia aims to help 60,000 people by expanding access to secure, affordable homes, empowering vulnerable communities and inspiring action across Australia and the Asia-Pacific region.

International Programs

climate resilient communities

Habitat's participatory approach builds capacities of communities to respond to climate risks. This includes through construction of appropriate critical infrastructure from housing and toilets, to flood embankments and drainage; and influencing government priorities.

adequate housing in informal urban settlements

Habitat is advocating for greater recognition and support to improve dire living conditions through more inclusive and responsive government policies and strategies.

women empowered to lead change

Habitat recognises that gender disparities mean women are more vulnerable to the impacts of natural disasters and climate change. We work with local communities to empower women, increasing their voice in identifying problems, and prioritising and leading solutions that will benefit them.





Australian Programs

maintenance and repairs for more liveable homes and communities

Our Habitat Women Social Enterprise and volunteer Brush with Kindness program provide maintenance services that maximise the supply of decent housing for people at risk of homelessness. Habitat Women also provide training and employment opportunities for women in construction.

constructing new housing for the most vulnerable

Habitat partners with specialist housing providers to construct new domestic violence refuges and other specialist housing.

innovative solutions for affordable and secure housing

Habitat's meanwhile use housing program repurposes underutilised properties into crisis or temporary housing solutions, creating safe shelter for those who need it most. Our subsidised rental program provides affordable secure rental housing for women and their children escaping violence.


